#### **Before Moving in – Tenant Checklist**

Inspect the property thoroughly, noting any wall cracks, paint issues, damaged tiles, leaking taps, or AC malfunctions. Take date-stamped photos or videos of every room. Check all fixtures and fittings such as light switches, electrical sockets, appliances, windows, doors, and locks to ensure they are functional. **Request a professional inspection report from a certified company like Dubai Property Snagging to identify defects before possession**. Review and sign a handover document that clearly lists all existing damages or issues before taking keys. Ensure DEWA, internet, and gas utilities are connected and tested.



## **During Tenancy**

Report any new maintenance issues to the landlord immediately in writing. Avoid making unauthorized modifications or installations in the property. Maintain cleanliness and perform routine care to avoid issues at the time of handover.

## **Before Moving Out – Tenant Checklist**

Provide a clean, habitable property at move-in. Carry out annual maintenance as required under Dubai tenancy laws. Return the security deposit within 14 days of lease termination unless damage is proven. Provide justification and proof for any deductions made from the deposit.
